Featured RCE Member: Jos Hermans Regional Advisor for Europe

1. Where does your passion for ESD come from?

My passion comes from my childhood, as my parents taught their children not to live indifferently. Several uncles, who were missionaries in Africa, brought the scent of other cultures into our family. For a major part of my life I have been member of the Dutch Ecologist Party. I was also a member of the provincial parliament of Limbhurg province, when I was in my twenties. Around 1990, I entered into higher professional education (Business School) and I fell into the discussion about the real goals of economics: stimulating shareholder-value or working towards equilibrium of employment, nature and democracy. Worldwide the fight is still going on. And I am still taking part in it.

2. What do you enjoy most about your role as an RCE Regional Advisor for Europe?

I worked for RCE Rhine-Meuse from 2005 to 2009. When I left the RCE I made myself available for assisting and facilitating RCEs in Europe. As an advisor for the RCEs I hope to assist RCEs in establishing cross-continental links. My special attention goes to linking African and European RCEs in common projects in formal but also non-formal education.

Another point of interest for me is filling the geographical gaps in RCE-coverage which still occur in Europe. I am especially focused on finding opportunities to stimulate RCE-initiatives in new European Union member countries and in the Balkans.

But in my work, I am not a coordinator for RCEs and I'm not in the middle of daily RCE-activities. Instead I strive to stay in the background, listening and watching as RCEs do their work. I shall always be available when I am asked to jump in and when I am needed. And yes, from time to time I give my opinion on specific matters unsolicited!

3. What is the greatest opportunity you see for RCEs in the coming year?

As the main construction work of "RCE-building" has been to a large extent achieved, our main challenge for the next few years will be to:

Stabilize the building (think of introducing a system of assessment, assisting new RCEs in their first years);
 Make use of the immense potential which we have created with this RCE-network (new projects, serving regional and national policies); and to

- Make ourselves known as a reputable partner in ESD. Let's not forget: BE GOOD AND TELL IT!

4. What are your personal ambitions for the year ahead?

Alongside my work for the RCE-community I am also an active member of the Netherlands Senior Experts, a group of persons who are available for assisting new economic activities in upcoming countries. It is my personal ambition for 2013 to bring together European and African schools, NGOs, and RCEs(!) in at least 1 new ESD project.

And my favorite idea at this very moment is to develop a methodology that can be used regionally and totally bottom up by any group of persons who want to create new learning facilities that are fully coherent with local and regional needs.

5. Tell us something about yourself that most people in the RCE network don't know.

I love Italian opera, Russian ballet and African religious music. And I adore my grandchildren. Anyone who is available to chat with me on these two subjects has my full attention!
